

MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Welcome to Salesian Secondary College, a co-educational, Catholic secondary school for 12 to 19 year old learners, set on nearly 500 acres of magnificent farmland. Our school is located mere moments from the N69, in the beautiful, rolling countryside of Pallaskenry, Co. Limerick. Only 15 minutes from the Dock Road roundabout in Limerick City, we attract students from the city, the immediate locality of Pallaskenry, Clarina and Kildimo, and from Shanagolden, Askeaton, Foynes, Ballysteen, Adare, Patrickswell, Kilcornan, Mungret, Dooradoyle, Crecora and Raheen. We are a proud Limerick school! Students of all abilities and faiths choose our school because of our reputation for providing an ambitious and successful teaching and learning environment in a caring, secure, supportive ethos.

Our Salesian heritage is the cornerstone of our work with your sons and daughters. The founder of the Salesian Order, St. John Bosco, was a young man when he arrived in Turin in the early 1800s and found young people, struggling to be heard and to find direction. His enduring message to us, as teachers, is to create a school of reason, religion and loving kindness and to place young people at the heart of all we do. He asked us to create a safe community, that reflects four distinct places of belonging for the young: the family, the church, the school and the playground. He tells us that your sons and daughters are to be celebrated and encouraged, so that they can reach their emotional, spiritual, learning and physical potential, experience joy and become good Christians and honest citizens.

We have a committed, creative and expert teaching and support staff, who strive to make the learning process enjoyable and appropriately challenging for all students. We offer a diverse curriculum of academic, practical and pastoral subjects. We are continually developing as a school and constantly learning from each other and from our young people. In this way, we stay current and innovative in our efforts to provide the best education possible for your child.

Our school was founded by the Salesian Order of Don Bosco in 1919. We have been on this Copsewood campus for over 100 years.

We have a record of excellence based on the following:

- Close proximity to the western suburbs of Limerick City and a comprehensive school transport system from around the county and city

- Designated outdoor teaching and performance space in our "Cruinniú"
- Approval for an additional state of the art new building of specialist and general classroom space, currently
 in planning
- A technologically advanced school fully networked throughout, with ready access to online learning for all learners, where appropriate
- An extraordinary extra-curricular programme, encompassing a diversity of cultural and sporting activities, with something for everyone to enjoy
- A uniquely warm atmosphere, where teachers establish a rapport and provide personal care and attention to each student, so that each is known as an individual with talents and strengths
- A designated Career Guidance service, preparing students for lifelong learning and identifying clear pathways to further education and career development
- A dedicated Pastoral Care Team, providing a listening ear and guidance to students throughout their school life
- An excellent relationship with all our partners in education: students, parents / guardians, Board of Management, Trustees and the wider community
- A carefully planned programme of 1st Year induction, enabling a managed transition from primary school to secondary school

Our school offers a six-year post primary education – three years junior cycle and three years senior cycle. Transition year within the senior cycle is optional. We offer a comprehensive range of subjects to our students in both cycles, subject to minimum numbers in option subjects.

Junior Cycle

The Junior Cycle framework concentrates on the building of key life skills in young adolescents, to prepare them for their lives as young and growing adults in the senior cycle and after Leaving Certificate. These skills are developed in each learner across a wide range of subjects. Students are formally assessed throughout 1st, 2nd and 3rd Year through CBAs and ATs (Classroom Based Assessments and Assessment Tasks) and they take final, formal written examinations at the end of 3rd Year. The Junior Certificate Profile of Achievement brings together these elements of assessment and reports on Other Areas of Learning. The Certificate is rewarded by the State Examinations Commission. Our Junior Certificate students study a combination of core subjects, short courses, optional subjects and non-exam subjects, keeping them busy and providing a focus during the often challenging years of early adolescence.



Transition Year

Transition Year is an optional programme possible for post-Junior Certificate students, following interview. The focus of the year is on providing students with a wide educational experience and a balance between academic and practical studies. It provides an extra year of growing up and encourages personal and social development. The programme provides opportunities for the development of our students' confidence, independence, communication, leadership, maturity and team skills. The programme challenges students to step out of their comfort zones into new areas of experience, learning and friendship.

The Salesian Secondary College TY Programme offers guidance and taster courses in all our Leaving Certificate subjects, enabling students to make informed choices for their senior years. The programme is modified annually, according to student and staff interests. In recent years, we have offered courses in Film, Philosophy, Craft, Electronics, Dance, Games, Sport Leadership, Young Scientist, Gaisce, Debating, Life Skills, Safe Food, Nutrition, Hair and Beauty, Design, fully utilising the talents, interests, training and expertise of our wonderful teaching staff.

TY offers the perfect opportunity for our most ambitious and our most vulnerable students to get extra support, as they prepare for the challenge of Leaving Certificate and life after school.





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SCHOOL ORGANISATION

Salesian Secondary College is a Catholic school, which aspires to bring about the full development of all its members in the Salesian tradition. Don Bosco's preventive system of education places the young person at the heart of all that we do. We encourage all our students to develop the necessary skills and talents that will enable them to reach their emotional, learning and spiritual potential, to live life to the full in pursuit of their dreams.



Management of Behaviour

Our Code of Behaviour exists to outline positive behaviour which is encouraged and negative behaviour which is discouraged. The Code is based on fairness and due process, giving all students a chance to come out of difficult situations with dignity. Positive behaviour is encouraged and rewarded through the Don Bosco Merit System. The Code is available on our website.



Anti-Bullying School

We have a ratified Anti-Bullying Policy and a Student Anti-Bullying Charter. Students are encouraged to manage relationships with respect and kindness. Our Acceptable Usage Policy underpins the responsibility of each member of the school community to behave kindly online.



Care of your Child

Overall care of each year group is coordinated by a Year Head. Within the year group, each class has a specific teacher assigned to it as a Class Tutor. Our Pastoral Care Team's listening service is available to all students. In addition, students are invited to speak with our Guidance Counsellors', Chaplains, Adult Mentors, Student "Ceangail" Leaders or any trusted teacher, if they have struggles. Our SNA team, Additional Needs team, Den staff and Able Students' Committee are also available and there to help. We strive to ensure that no student is anonymous and that every child feels a sense of belonging to our school.



Parents as Partners

Regular contact with parents / guardians is maintained. Parents and guardians are encouraged to become involved in our Parents' Association and the many events organised by that group. Please keep your contact details up to date in the office.

Additional Educational Needs

Students learn in different ways. The care of students with additional educational needs rests with the class teacher primarily. The work of the teacher is supported by SNAs and Resource Teachers. Team teaching, resource teaching, small class sizes, learning support, assistive technology and differentiation are provided for students where need is identified and resources allow. Students are assessed early in 1st Year and vulnerable learners are identified and supported appropriately.



Homework Assessment and Work Ethic

Students are assessed fairly and on a continuous basis (at the end of a period of learning). Formal examination takes place periodically. Full reports on academic progress in each subject are made available through VSWare. Supervised study is run each evening after school for a nominal charge. Study is supervised by our own teachers and an atmosphere conducive to study in the school is maintained.

Sport

Staff members volunteer to mentor and train students in a variety of sports and games. Our excellent facilities include:

The Den

The Den is a highly specialised unit within our mainstream school, which is open (numbers permitting) to students who have a recommendation for an ASD Special Class Place. The Den's aim is to offer appropriate learning experiences for students with ASD in a differentiated setting, according to priority of need. specialised resources available from the NSCE. Our 3 class unit caters for a maximum of 18 students, ranging from 1st to 6th Year. A team of teachers, and up to 6 SNas, provide a tailor made programme for learners. Admission to the Den is only possible if numbers allow and if the admissions criteria, outlined in our Admissions and Enrolment Policies, are met. Students have access to a modern canteen service which provides hot and cold meal options at discounted prices Breakfast, Break time, lunchtime and after school options are available.
